ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

- 80% of the cane farm area is in the best management practice program, Smartcane BMP.
- Eight of Australia's sugar mills are
 Bonsucro certified, an internationally
 recognised standard for environmental
 and social impacts of sugarcane
 production.
- Chemicals not permitted under the Bonsucro standards are not used on Australian farms.
- Australian sugar mills generate 27% of Queensland's renewable electricity.

 Australian sugar is of high quality, sustainably and ethically produced.
 The industry is focused on continual, verifiable improvement, such as through international certification.

FAMILY OWNED

- Paul Schembri grows 10,000 tonnes of cane each year in partnership with his brother, in Mackay, Queensland.
- He is the third generation of his family to farm in Australia after emigrating from Malta.



SOLUTIONS

 To stop sediment loss he uses a system of minimum tillage and keeping a mulch blanket intact between cane rows.



ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBLITY

- Paul takes his environmental responsibility and proximity to the Great Barrier Reef very seriously.
- His farms have been accredited under Smartcane BMP for five years.
